It is with great sadness that we announce the sudden passing of our dear friend and former Chief Executive, Richard Chester. Richard was a visionary within music education in Scotland and beyond, always striving to create more opportunities for young musicians in both classical and jazz. He will be greatly missed, and our thoughts are with his family and friends at this very difficult time.

"Richard carried himself with such dignity, but I always found him very approachable.

Even when I first auditioned for NYOS at 13, I felt like I was taken very seriously and respected. He treated everyone with the same courtesy and consideration, and that will be one of his hallmarks." Colin Currie, Percussionist

Born and educated in Yorkshire, and a graduate of the Royal Academy of Music in London, Richard came to Scotland in 1967 to join the Scottish National Orchestra and for 14 years he was its principal flautist. In 1987 he left to take the reins at the National Youth Orchestra of Scotland (initially as Administrator, and latterly Chief Executive). He stayed in that role for twenty years, leaving behind an incredible musical and educational legacy. He grew the opportunities available for young musicians, expanding the pathway to include the NYOS Children's Orchestra as well as the pre-professional Camerata. At the same time, he broadened those opportunities by introducing the Jazz Orchestra and programme.

"Under Richard's leadership, NYOS Jazz was both supported and nurtured, as he allowed it the creative freedom to expand and excel, year after year. He will be greatly missed."

Always keen to ensure that Scotland's young musicians could receive international recognition and experience, he organised many overseas tours, as well as being a founder member of the European Federation of National Youth Orchestras and the World Federation of Amateur Orchestras.

"Richard Chester was a giant in everything he did - a fiercely intelligent man and a visionary, he had an impact on the lives of so many young people in Scotland. After retiring as Chief Executive, he went on to Chair the NYOS Endowment Trust, a position he held until 2019. Richard was also made a fellow of the Royal Academy of Music in 2003, but perhaps his greatest legacy is to be found in the lives of the countless musicians he influenced, supported and guided throughout his life.

"Richard was involved with NYOS Endowment Trust from the outset; since 1998 the Trust has awarded nearly £900,000 to support NYOS's valuable work with the young musicians to whom Richard devoted his creativity and energy for over 40 years. Without Richard Chester's vision the National Youth Orchestras of Scotland would not be the unique, robust and accessible organisation it is today, and there would be no jazz programme to partner the classical pathway he pioneered.

"If it had not been for his vision and determination, NYOS Jazz would never have come into being. Richard approached me in 1990 about the possible setting up of a Jazz Course. After the first one had taken place, I remember saying to him 'Well you can now get on with the real NYOS' and he replied, 'This IS the real NYOS' - and he really believed in it."

It feels somewhat fitting that in 2021 we will celebrate 25 years of both the Children's Orchestra (now Junior Orchestra) and Jazz education and performance at NYOS. A year in which we had already planned to mark Richard's pivotal role in introducing Jazz to NYOS and to innumerable young musicians and celebrate his fantastic musical and educational legacy in Scotland and beyond. We are deeply saddened that this celebration will now be in his memory rather than along with this gracious and kind gentleman, but celebrate we will!

During his 20 years at the helm of NYOS, Richard Chester transformed it from an organisation with one orchestra to one with some eight different ensembles making it the envy of most other countries. Overseas trips were a regular feature with many concerts performed in Europe but also as far afield as China. In all of these trips the musicians were acclaimed as wonderful ambassadors for Scotland. Richard was always a joy to work with because he was able to combine the attributes of a top-quality musician with a brilliant administrator. He engaged and managed inspirational conductors and soloists but at all times the organisation kept functioning smoothly. His ability to spot young talent was exemplified when he appointed Nicola Benedetti as leader of the first Children's Orchestra even though she was one of the youngest players.
